

Additional Information and Resources in Santa Barbara County

The website for Santa Barbara County waste reduction programs is www.lessismore.org. It is easy to navigate and has a convenient search tool and easily accessible sections for recycling and household hazardous waste.

On the home page you can find information relevant to The Family Car lesson. Click on "County Programs", Link #17 is the Recycling Resource Guide, which also contains a sub-link to information about used oil recycling (It has is own page!). The Guide also has links to different subject pages which are PDFs and very suitable for printing. You'll find information on how to recycle all kinds of materials throughout the county. (There is also a link to updates since the guide is published every other year.)

Within the Recycling Resource Guide, you'll find a link to six pages on household hazardous waste. You can also access information on this topic directly from the www.lessismore.org home page at link #10. Note, as you scroll down this section and click "Business with Hazardous Waste page" there will be a long list of materials and prices for disposal. The disposal prices refer to businesses only; hazardous waste drop-off is free for residents.

There are several locations in the county (called "ABOPs") where certain materials, including antifreeze, batteries, oil, and paint, may be dropped off, as well as three comprehensive household hazardous waste ("HHW") facilities. The HHW facilities are listed at the end of the Family Car student book. The County also provides one-day HHW collection events in the Santa Ynez Valley and New Cuyama. Information about these events is also on the website.

The City of Santa Barbara website, www.sbrecycles.org, is very accessible, with lots of pictures and easy links for single-family and apartment residents. There is a great section on reuse with lists of thrift stores and flea markets.

Nuts-and-bolts information about recycling and trash service can be obtained from some haulers' websites. These include:

The City of Goleta website, <u>www.cityofgoleta.org</u>, has a section on recycling, but it is difficult to find. Start with "City Hall" from the right of the page under "Public Works," look for "Solid Waste and Environmental Services Program." This page has a link to Recyclables and Waste Disposal.

The City of Santa Maria website, www.ci.santa-maria.ca.us, has recycling information under "Residents" in the menu at the left of the home page. Then click on "Utilities (City Water, Sewer, Trash)." Scroll down the utilities page to find "Solid Waste Division."

The City of Lompoc website, <u>www.cityoflompoc.com</u>, has recycling information under "Solid Waste" in the "Fast Find" section at the top right-hand corner of the home page.

The City of Carpinteria website, www.carpinteria.ca.us, has a section on "Disposing of Hazardous Materials." From the home page select "Government" and then "Public Works" and then "Engineering" and lastly "Solid Waste." You can also access information about recycling by selecting "Local Info" and then "Utility Providers" to find a link to the hauler E.J. Harrison Disposal.

The web site <u>www.sbwellnessdirectory.com</u> has links to environmental organizations and programs in the area. Select "links" from the menu at the top of the page.
